THE NEW CABINET.

Coming Change Brings Out Probable Personnel of New Follo.

Washington, Nov. 4.—It is presumed the first official announcement by Taft will be the appointment of a new cabinet. The following are some suggested possible appointees:

Secretary of state, Meyer; secretary of the treasury, Loeb; secretary of the navy, Newberry; postmaster general, Hitchcock; secretary of agriculture, Gifford Pinchot; attorney general, Kellogg.

surprises of the election. Johnson, republican, will probably be elected in North Dakota over Burke democrat.

Governor Warner of Michigan, will probably be defeated by L. Theamsen, democrat, though the state is safely republican.

Chances favor the election of democrats in many hot contests in Indiana, Nebraska and Minnesota.

Governor John S. Johnson was re-elected in Minnesota by a reduced plurality.

Thomas Marshall, democrat, carried Indiana under a remarkable circumstance, as the state went for Taft, and all others on the democratic state ticket were beaten.

Shallenberger will probably be the winner in Nebraska, though the result is still doubtful.

Governor Davidson, republican, carried Wisconsin, according to today's returns. Other governors to be elected, were Ansel, democrat, South Carolina; Vessey, republican, South Dakota; Patterson, democrat, Tennessee; Sosgrove, republican, Washington; Glasscock, republican, West Virginia.

The Missouri race between Hadley, republican, and Cowherd, democrat, is doubtful. The same condition exists in Ohio, where Harman, democrat, and Harris, republican, both claim the election.

A SOCIALIST INCREASE.

Industrial Centers Fall Down, But in the National as a Whole, Increases.

Chicago, Nov. 4.—The socialist vote of 15,000, shows a loss of 12,000 from the figures of 1904. In explanation of this condition of affairs, National Committeeman Simon said today:

"The reduction is largely due to the results of efforts of the organization to make its members support the old parties."

The increase in the socialist vote of the entire country will be 50 per cent, despite the falling off in industrial centers.

With the election of Judge Taft to the presidency there will be no lull in business. That is assured.
