UNION WINS FROM COVE

Cove, Nov. 4.—(Special).—The Union-Cove high schools played football resulting in a victory for the former by a score of 6 to 5. Cove played a strictly school team, while Union's lineup included several non-student players.

Cove's backs seemed to tear through the line at will, falling in yardage only once. Union repeatedly lost on downs and was often forced to kick.

Cove made the first touchdown in three minutes of play by a series of tackle bucks. Walters, Conley and Robertson carried the ball for good gains.

Union's touchdown was made by Neesley, who caught a punt and raced down the side line through a scattered field. Two of Cove's heavy linemen were not in the game, and it is believed that over-confidence played a large part in Cove's defeat. It was a poor exhibition for spectators on this account.

Notice is hereby given that on Tuesday, the 24th day of November, 1908, a special election will be held of the voters of the City of La Grande, Union county, Oregon, and that the polls will be open from the hour of 9 o'clock a. m., until the hour of five o'clock p. m., of said day.

Said election is called by order of the Council of the City of La Grande for the purpose of proposing and submitting to the people of the City of La Grande the approval and adoption of certain amendments to the charter of the city of La Grande as shown by the proposed charter heretofore approved by the council of the City of La Grande by ordinance No. 332, Series 1908, and filed with, and in the office of the recorder of the city of La Grande, on the 10th day of September, 1908.

The approval of these amendments by the people of the city of La Grande will be submitted to the voters on the following proposition:

Shall the City of La Grande amend its charter and approve the amendments to the city charter, and the new city charter proposed and submitted by the council to the people of the city of La Grande?
