CALIFORNIA HAY CROP SHORT.

Golden State Hay Dealers Look to Oregon for Salvation.

San Francisco, Nov. 5.—Hay dealers in all parts of the state discontinued selling hay today, following the publication of a report by the San Francisco Hay association there there is a possibility that all horses and cattle of the state will be on short rations, as a result of the hay shortage which was created by the dry year in Nevada and Utah.

California merchants are looking to Oregon and Washington to make up the shortage. Corp experts report the indications are that 100,000 tons less are available now than at this time last year.

About 3500 boxes of Newtown apples were picked from the Rapp & Oatman orchard near Talent, this season, besides several hundred boxes of Spitzenbergs and Winesaps.

Columbus, O., Nov. 5.—As Senator Foraker's term expires before the special tariff revision session of congress there will be no session of the new legislature of Ohio in the meantime Harmon might have appointed a successor of Foraker to serve in the special session. Republican leaders are trying to prevent it and it is expected Governor Harris will call a new legislature in special session January 2 to elect a senator.

One Successful Democrat.

Fargo, N. D., Nov. 5.—Today's returns confirm the election of Burke, democrat, for governor. He is the only democrat elected.

C. M. & St. P. Retrenches.

Lacrosse, Wis., Nov. 5.—A reduction to \$1.25 per day in wages of section hands and discontinuance of all improvement work was ordered today by the Chicago, Milwaukee & St. Paul road.

HOUNDS TRACE EXTORTER.

Thought Mount Vernon Highwayman Will Soon Be Trapped.

Seattle, Nov. 5.—With bloodhounds upon the trail, it is claimed today that Leo Besemer, who attempted to extort \$5000 from E. P. English, a wealthy logger of Mount Vernon, after chaining him to a tree, will soon be caught.

The dogs followed the trail from Silvana to Lakewood yesterday. Investigations today are that the highwayman is headed for the delta country north of Everett or south of Marysville. He is probably desirous of reaching Seattle. A plot has been discovered in which a number of shingle weavers have been aiding Besemer to escape.
