## SCHEDULE FOR DEBATES

Pendleton, Nov. 6.—On January 10 or some other date about that time, the Pendleton high school and Baker City high school will meet in debate, and it will be the first contest of the season for the local students.

Following the debate between Baker and Pendleton the winner will debate with the Ontario high school.

An announcement to this effect was received here today by Roy Rowland of the high school, from Superintendent Churchill of Baker City.

By the first of next week a bulletin will be out setting forth all the debates to be held this year and also the subjects to be discussed.

Aside from the Pendleton, Baker City and Ontario high schools other institutions in the eastern Oregon debating league are the high schools of Sherman county, Crook county, Hood River, The Dalles, La Grande, Union and Wallowa.

In selecting the contestants from the various schools local tryout debates are held. Thus far no preliminary debates have been held here, but the work will be taken up in due time.

In the Pendleton high school there are four or five students with marked debating ability and it is strongly hoped that they will be able to win this year.

### Ordinance No. 398, Series 1908.

An ordinance amending section 6 of ordinance No. 42, series 1892. The City of La Grande does Ordain as Follows:

Section 1. That section 6, of ordinance No. 42, series 1892, be and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

Section 6. It shall be unlawful for any person to deposit any ashes in any wooden vessel or on any wooden floor in the city, or deposit them in any place in their, or others' premises that will be nearer than ten feet to any wooden work, or to burn any paper, straw, tree cuttings, or other trash or rubbish in any street or alley, except by permission of the chief of the fire department.

Section 2. This ordinance shall be published in one issue of the La Grande Evening Observer, and shall take effect on and after the 15th day of December, 1908.

Passed the common council on the 11th day of November, 1908, by seven members of the council voting therefor.

The approval of these amendments by the people of the city of La Grande will be submitted to the voters on the following proposition:

Shall the City of La Grande amend its charter and approve the amendments to the city charter, and the new city charter proposed and submitted by the council to the people of the city of La Grande?
