## FARMERS TO BUILD LINES

The promoters of the Columbia and Walla Walla Electric road from Walla Walla to Wallula, have offered to turn over to the Farmers' Co-operative union, on condition that they complete the line. This offer must be accepted by November 29, or the offer will lapse.

All franchises and the name of the corporation will be transferred to the farmers union without the payment of any money. The original promoters of the line taking stock in the company for the amount of money actually expended by them in cash since the road was first projected.

Farmers and others interested in the building of the line will meet at the Commercial club rooms Wednesday afternoon at 2:30, when the plans will be finally discussed.

One of the conditions of the transfer is that the organization remain as a strictly local proposition, stock to be held by the farmers interested.—Walla Walla Bulletin.
