BUSY POINT FOR SHIPPERS

Thirty-five carloads of choice eastern Oregon timber converted into lumber by the George Palmer Lumber company, have been shipped to eastern markets the past month. Added to these shipments, from the mills of the county, the grand total of shipments for the past month reach a big sum and speaks highly of the industry as carried on here.

Big Sheep Shipment.
 While lumber in these large lots have been shipped out, stock is rapidly being sent to the east and west from Union and Wallowa counties. Twelve cars—double decked—are being loaded with sheep at Wallowa today and will come out tomorrow evening with the regular train. This is one of the largest shipments to come over the new extension.

Feeding in La Grande.
 Ten carloads of stock from the east destined to points west, were detained in La Grande today for feeding purposes. The yards in this city rank with those at Echo as feeding centers. To these 10 carloads tonight will be added 19 additional carloads, and the entire train will then proceed westward.

Special Election to Approve Charter Amendments.
 Notice is hereby given that on Tuesday, the 24th day of November, 1908, a special election will be held of the voters of the City of La Grande, Union county, Oregon, and that the polls will be open from the hour of 9 o'clock a. m., until the hour of five o'clock p. m., of said day.

Said election is called by order of the Council of the City of La Grande for the purpose of proposing and submitting to the people of the City of La Grande the approval and adoption of certain amendments to the charter of the city of La Grande as shown by the proposed charter heretofore approved by the council of the City of La Grande by ordinance No. 392, Series 1908, and filed with, and in the office of the recorder of the city of La Grande, on the 19th day of September, 1908.

The approval of these amendments by the people of the city of La Grande will be submitted to the voters on the following proposition:

Shall the City of La Grande amend its charter and approve the amendments to the city charter, and the new city charter proposed and submitted by the council to the people of the city of La Grande?
