The feeding qualities of alfalfa are being better understood each year. When first introduced it was considered only fit for the dairy cow; then its use was made known for fattening hogs and now it is found to be equally good for horses, many teamsters doing heavy work preferring it at the price, to timothy. For years it was never baled. This season several carloads have been shipped. Like the fruit industry, many at first thought the increased acreage would glut the market, but as long as alfalfa can be either fed or shipped it will continue to be a profitable crop. There are few locations where what is known as alfalfa land is not worth \$100 per acre.

There are very few people who kept in close touch with the work of Francis J. Heney that would have been surprised at his assassination in the months gone by since he became famous on this coast but this natural fear had worn away and when the news was brought to this city last night and bulletined in the windows and flashed on the curtains in the theaters it created much surprise and was the principal topic of conversation in the hotel lobbies, cigar stores and public places.

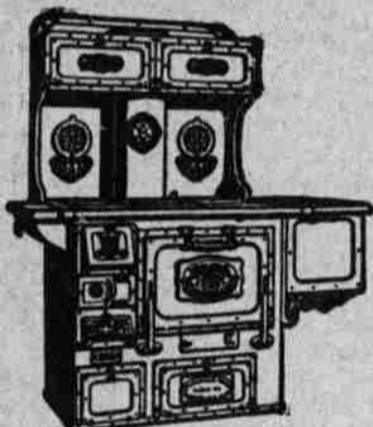
