The month of October, which is usually dull as far as shipments of local commodities are concerned, was an exceptionally active one this year, according to figures compiled by local Agent Keeney. Too early to include extensive apple business and, too late to embrace summer fruit shipments, the following October shipments exemplifies the varied line of industries and the total bulk of freight business originating here for points east on interline shipments, and for local business, east and west:

- Eastern or Interline.
  - Apples, 15 carloads.
  - Sugar, 1 carload.
  - Lumber, 90 carloads.
  - Flour, 4 carloads.
  - Feed, 3 carloads.
- Local, East and West.
  - Cattle, 7 carloads.
  - Horses, 1 carload.
  - Emigrants, 3 carloads.
  - Hay, 10 carloads.
  - Household goods, 5 carloads.
  - Feed, 3 carloads.
  - Flour, 3 carloads.
  - Oats, 6 carloads.
  - Brick, 2 carloads.
  - Sugar, 5 carloads.
  - Wheat 24 carloads.
  - Barley, 5 carloads.
  - Potatoes, 3 carloads.
