Our city tax levy. How many mills? That is the problem which the the session scheduled for this evening.

There are two at least new condifions that have to be faced and met. One is our revenues are reduced as compared with former years, to the extent of about \$7500, caused by the loss of saloon licenses and fines. The other is a fixed expense of \$8000 to meet the interest on the \$160,000 Beaver creek water bonds, which were recently sold. These two conditions make it necessary to raise \$15,500 by way of taxation additional as compared with last year. The taxable property of the city is \$1,300,000. To meet the above a 12-mill tax will be required; 3 mills are required to provide for the interest of our water and city hall bonds (\$75,000) and the general expenses of the city last year required 7 mills. On this basis 22 mills will be voted tonight. We may receive considerable relief on the interest account of the Beaver creek bonds owing to the fact that these bonds may not all be issued at once and only interest will be required, as the bonds are issued, and again, it is understood that the banks will pay 4 per cent in terest for the money as long as deposited up to the time of their withdrawal. As the bonds only draw 5 per cent, the loss would be small, consequently it might be possible this year to trim down the levy to 17 or left ear. 18 mills. It is quite evident that this is going to be a difficult year to finance. However, our fixed expenses are such that it will be many years
