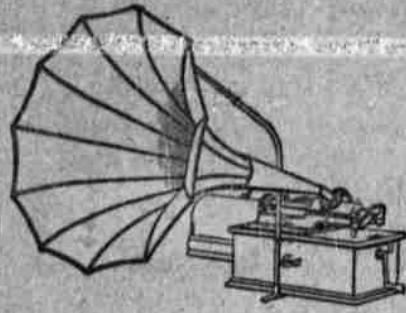

## EVE OF GREATEST GAME OF SEASON PROMISES MUCH

University of Oregon, Eugene, Nov. 20.—(Special.)—Preparations are under way in Eugene for a monster excursion of students and townspeople tomorrow to see the O. A. C.-Oregon game in Portland. The excursion train has been made up and stands on the side track in the local yards. It consists of an engine and 18 coaches, all decorated with a profusion of yellow and green, the colors of the university. The words, "University of Oregon," are spelled out in large yellow letters, one letter being placed on each of the 18 cars. Practically the entire student body and hundreds of town people will go on the excursion train, which will leave Eugene at 1:10 tomorrow morning. A huge college seal is on the front of the engine, with the university motto, "Men's agitat molem," which for this occasion, freely translated, means, "Beat O. A. C."

The team itself are by no means confident of victory, and are hoping for any favorable score, however small. The team is in excellent condition, and is not at all disheartened by the two recent defeats, although they admit that O. A. C. has all the chances when comparative scores are considered, beside the advantage of seven veterans on the team and a light schedule. Pinkham can be depended upon to stop everything through the left side of the line. Clarke and Wolfe will be seen against each other in another battle of the giants when it comes to punting. What the redoubtable Jamieson can do through the line of the 'varsity is yet to be seen. Moulton and Wolf are the place kickers for the two teams. Moulton, the Oregon captain, has more place kicks to his credit than any other player in the history of the college northwest. In the Idaho game he broke the world's record for a distance place kick, and 'varsity's ball anywhere near the center of the field

may mean a score.
