Grande Ronde Should Make An Effort

to Be Represented-Twenty Boxes of Oregon's Best Will Be Displayed in Show Window of Largest Department Store in the World, for 10

Oregon apples, fit for kings, will be shown about Christmas time in a New York store window in a way that will attract widespread attention. Twenty boxes of the best fruit the state produces will be presented by the Portland Commercial club to King Edward VII and Emperor Wilhelm of Germany. Before being shipped to the titled recipients the fruit will be exhibited in the window of Macy's, New York, one of the biggest department stores in the world.

This advertisement of Oregon apples probably will be the most striking the fruit has ever received. The 20 boxes of apples will be on display in Macy's window for 10 days. They will be admired by literally millions of people, for undoubtedly more peoole pass this store, prominently located on Sixth avenue, in any given time than any other corner in America, if not in the whole world.

The 20 boxes of apples will be bought by the Commercial club from the showing to be made here early in December by the state horticultura associations. The use of the window in the New York store was secured by Julius Meler of this city. The first week in December will be
