## COVE BOYS WILL BE A WORKING MODEL DAIRY

### GOOD EXHIBITION PROMISED FOR THANKSGIVING DAY.

Several of the Cove Players Injured in Practice and Former Games. But by Next Thursday the Hospital Will Be Empty and La Grande Will Face One of the Strongest Aggregations of the Season—Scoreless Game is Predicted.

Cove, Nov. 21.—With the big game at La Grande less than a week distant, many of the local supporters of the Cove high school are feeling a bit anxious about Cove's chances of capturing the championship next Thursday.

While the general feeling optimistic, there are a few doubters who look for a no-score game at best.

Walters, the crack half, received a severe injury to his right foot recently in practice. It is feared that one of the small bones is broken. Richards, right end, had a severe bump in the Elgin game, but will probably be all right for the big game.

Conley, Robinson and Lantz have also received injuries in practice recently, and the team is generally bruised and sore from much hard work.

Cove has won every high school game in which she has taken part this season, with the exception of the La Grande game, which was a tie, and it is conceded that the championship rests between these two teams. For this reason, the Thanksgiving game at La Grande promises to be an exceptionally good exhibition.

### Truly Thankful.

Yesterday one of the teachers in the city grammar school asked her pupils to make a list of 10 things to be thankful for. The answers varied greatly, and the reasons to be thankful ranged almost from the sublime to the ridiculous. Upon one subject, however, the boys were almost a unit. The newest Yakima industry, a model dairy, costing \$30,000, built and owned by Mrs. Frank Rudkin, will begin operations Monday. The dairy is to be absolutely up to date, hygienic in every particular, and the carefully washed cows will be milked by dairy maids who will wear white coats and trousers. The milk will be pasteurized and cooled before delivery, and everything new in dairying is embodied in this model plant. The health authorities, the pure food inspectors and the general public will be invited to a formal opening, when the plant will be thrown open to inspection within the next two weeks.

Donate \$35.85 to Boys & Girls' Aid Society.

Yesterday was the date selected to give those attending the public schools in La Grande an opportunity to make a contribution for the sustenance of the Boys & Girls' Aid society in Portland. When the reports were all turned in it was found that the cash receipts amounted to \$35.85, a splendid showing as compared with last year, when the receipts amounted to \$18.27. Last year the La Grande schools stood fifth and reports are awaited with interest this year. It seems quite probable that few schools will lead us this year. The object is a worthy one, and it is a part of our education to contribute to such worthy institutions.
