CORONER WOULD KNOW

Attorney Must Say Who Hired Him to Represent Mrs. Haas.

San Francisco, Nov. 21.—A subpoena was issued today for the arrest of Joseph F. Seymour, Jr., of Los Angeles, who was representing Mrs. Morris Haas during the inquest of Henry's assailant. Mrs. Haas on the stand today informed Coroner Leland that she did not know who employed Seymour and that she had no money. The coroner is desirous of knowing who employed the attorney. The woman nearly collapsed when she testified regarding her married life. She declared her husband was agitated and sleepless many nights before he shot Henry, but never saw a revolver in his possession. Detective Tom Ryan, who slept with a Derlinger in his shoe, showed upon the stand his ankle marked with rust stain and a hole worn in his sock. This corroborates

the evidence of the gun expert who declared that if Haas carried the little pistol in his shoe 24 hours, as claimed by Chief of Police Biggley, it would have shown rust marks.

MEETING OF PARK BOARD

ENTHUSIASTIC AND SUCCESSFUL MEETING IN CLUB ROOMS.

By-Laws Adopted This Afternoon—Plans of Raising Funds Discussed—Many Names Already on Roll—W. H. Bohnenkamp Has Honor of Being First.

If the enthusiasm displayed at the meeting of the Riverside Park association this afternoon may be considered as indicative of the future, then the park is assured. As a matter of fact, the park is assured anyway, but far sooner than most have believed possible, the plans of the public-spirited ladies who are responsible for the movement will have been carried out, and La Grande will have a beautiful playground. As an attraction for our citizens and as an advertisement for the city, it will exceed anything else of which we can boast and will set a pace for our sister cities.

The meeting was called this afternoon for several purposes, chief of which was to read and discuss the by-laws of the organization, prepared by Mesdames Schilke, Palmer and Bragg. The report of this committee was adopted practically without change. Means of raising money were discussed and several plans were tentatively discussed. But the main object of the meeting, the adoption of the by-laws, thereby placing the organization on a more firm and satisfactory footing, was the chief business of the afternoon.

The business men of the town are second only to the ladies in their enthusiasm, and two of these gentlemen, W. H. Bohnenkamp and Sam Morris, were the very first to be issued receipts for membership dues. In Dr. Bacon the association has a most interested and enthusiastic member and supporter, and he declares that there will be 2000 members in less than six months. When The Observer representative left the hall Mr. Bacon had just led in some of his friends, willing captives, by the way, and kindly but firmly told them to ask for a membership certificate in the park association in the form of a receipt for \$1. It is safe to say that no occupant of the offices on the upper floor of the La Grande National Bank building escaped Dr. Bacon's vigilance.
