 Said election is called by order of the Council of the City of La Grande for the purpose of proposing and submitting to the people of the City of La Grande the approval and adoption of certain amendments to the charter of the city of La Grande as shown by the proposed charter heretofore approved by the council of the City of La Grande by ordinance No. 392, Series 1908, and filed with, and in the office of the recorder of the city of La Grande, on the 10th day of September, 1908.

The approval of these amendments by the people of the city of La Grande will be submitted to the voters on the following proposition:

**TALK BEETS AT WALLOWA**

Mass meetings are the order of the day at Wallowa county. At Enterprise tomorrow night and at Lostine the evening following, sugar beets will be the all-absorbing topic. Manager Fred C. Taylor left today for Wallowa county and with the assistance of F. S. Bramwell, will discuss the propagation of sugar beets from a commercial standpoint and attempt to get the farmers of that county to growing beets. With railroad facilities it would be an easy matter to transport the crop to the factory here, and a general effort will be made to get more beet growers to work. The experiment was tried in a very diminutive scale this summer, and Manager Taylor is convinced that beets will grow prolifically in that county. The meetings at Enterprise and Lostine will bring out discussions and perhaps verbal contracts for a large acreage of beets for next year.
