# UNIFORM BILL OF LADING

LA GRANDE SHIPPERS MUST ASCERTAIN REQUIREMENTS.

New Uniform Bill of Lading Which Becomes Effective December 1, on All Northwest Shipping Lines, is Described in Letter to Agent Keeney—Excerpts From the Letter.

The uniform bill of lading which becomes effective on the Harriman lines on December 1, is described in a long circular issued to all O. R. & N. agents, including J. H. Keeney of this city. The provisions are complicated and hard to solve, but shippers can acquaint themselves with the requirements by consulting Mr. Keeney between now and the time when the new system goes into effect.

Excerpts From Circular. A few of the more important provisions set out in the circular letter follow:

Attention is called to the fact that effective December 1, 1908, by Supplement No. 4 to the western classification No. 45, Rule 4 of the classification is changed to read in part as follows:

"Unless otherwise provided, when property is transported subject to the provisions of the western classification, the acceptance and use are required, respectively, of the 'uniform bill of lading,' 'straight' or 'order' as approved by the Interstate commerce commission by order No. 787 of June 27, 1908."

(A) In order that the consignor may have the option of shipping property either subject to the terms and conditions of the uniform bill of lading, or under the liability imposed upon common carriers by common law and the federal and state statutes applicable thereto, western classification provides for different rates and for different forms of bill of lading to be used, respectively, as the consignor may elect to have a limited liability or a common carrier's liability service.

(B) Unless otherwise provided in the classification, property will be carried at the reduced rate specified if shipped subject to all the terms and conditions of the uniform bill of lading. If consignor elects not to accept all the terms and conditions of the uniform bill of lading, he should so notify the agent of the forwarding carrier at the time his property is offered for shipment. If he does not give such notice, it will be understood that he desires his property carried subject to the terms and conditions of the uniform bill of lading in order to secure the reduced rate.

(C) Property carried not subject to all the terms and conditions of the uniform bill of lading will be at the carrier's liability, limited only as provided by common law and by the laws of the United States and of the several states in so far as they apply, but subject to the terms and conditions of the uniform bill of lading in so far as they are not inconsistent with such common carrier's liability, and the rate charged therefor will be ten per cent higher (subject to a minimum increase of one per cent per 1000 pounds) than the rate charged for property shipped subject to all the terms and conditions of the uniform bill of lading.

(D) When the consignor gives notice to the agent of the forwarding carrier that he elects not to accept all the terms and conditions of the uniform bill of lading, but desires a carrier's liability service at the higher rate charged for that service, the carrier must print, write or stamp upon the bill of lading a clause signed by the agent reading: "In consideration of the higher rate charged, the property herein described will be carried at the carrier's liability, limited only as provided by law, but subject to the terms and conditions of the uniform bill of lading, in so far as they are not inconsistent with such common carrier's liability."

The new uniform bills of lading referred to are of two kinds:

First: One covering so-called "straight consignments," being those other than "order consignments." This is form No. 1553, a non-negotiable document, bound 100 sets in each book.

Second: The so-called "order bill of lading" for use on shipments consigned to shipper's order, notify, etc. This is form No. 1564, a negotiable document, bound 50 sets in each book. Each bill of lading consists of a set

of three, namely: an original bill of lading, a shipping order and a memorandum copy, which should be written in manifold.

Such supply of the new forms as may be required will be furnished shippers by these companies on request.

## DISLIKE NEW PROPOSITION

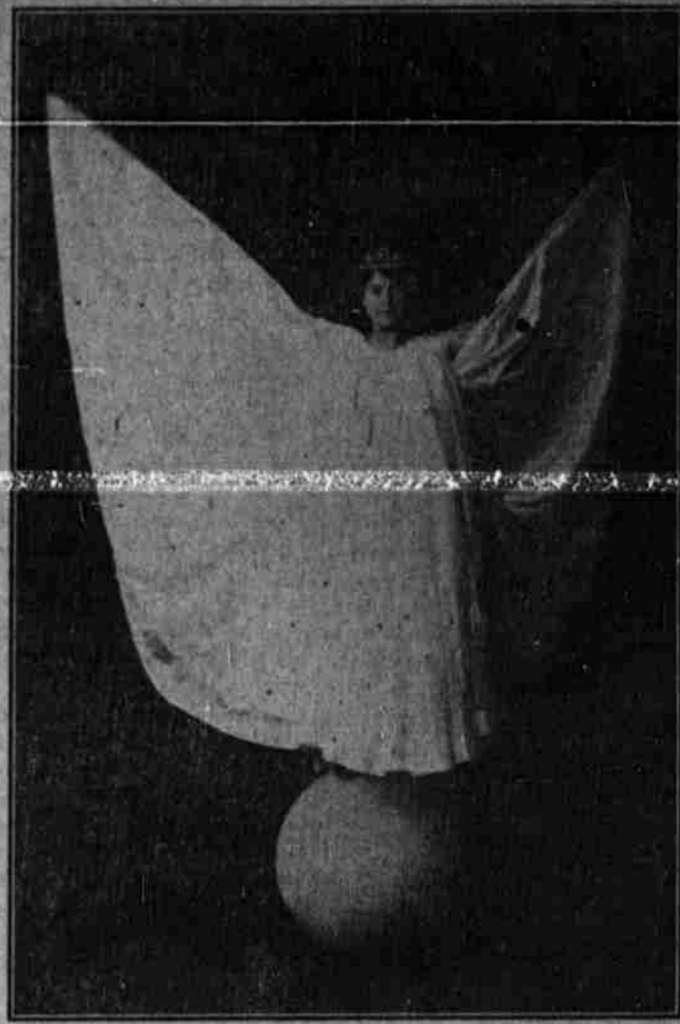
The formation of a monster combination of railroad brotherhoods as planned by the Denver convention of Federated Labor unions, is not meeting with an exceptionally large amount of favor in La Grande railroad circles. The railroaders argue that the formation of related brotherhoods is justifiable and practical, but to put our railroaders in the same category with engineers, and railroad bricklayers in a class with conductors, the result will be anything but satisfactory. To unite engineers, firemen, conductors and brakemen into one general brotherhood is practical, they argue, as their interests are in common to a certain extent. But that conductors should be called out on a strike because car repairers have a complaint, is not up to what many local railroaders call good judgment.

The formation of such a brotherhood has a wide meaning in this city, where there can be found members of a greater majority of all railroad brotherhoods.
