ley franchise, was accused on the stand by A. S. Lathan, his former chauffeur with influencing him to commit bribery before the grand jury at the time of the graft investigations, and he also said that Detective Burns urged him to tell untruths to the jury.

#### Lathan Implicates Burns.

At first Lathan denied any knowledge of Ruef's affairs. Suddenly, when confronted with his own affidavit in which he admitted taking Ruef to the offices of the United Railroads, he became rattled and confessed that he signed the affidavit at the request of Burns. The testimony was admitted after a bitter row in which Judge Harper, representing Lathan, objected. The affidavit said Ruef obtained a short box at a haberdashery and took it to the offices of the railway. He supposed it was bribe money which was taken from the offices in the box. This was in May, 1906. Lathan admitted he told untruths to the jury. "Who told you tell them?" was asked. "Burns and Ruef," said the witness.
