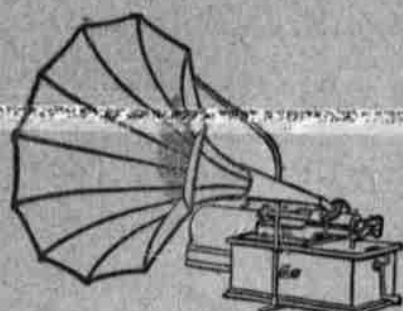

Sash and Door Factory.
C. H. Brown, western representative for the lumber firm of Radford Bros., of Oshkosh, Wis., is now making arrangements for the erection of a planer, sash and door cutting plant. It is to be located by the track, this side of the old planer. The contract has been let to Peter Bosquet of La Grande. The foundation was completed today and the building will begin at once. The concern will not only use material from the sawmills of this vicinity, but from Haines, Union and other points, Radford Bros. taking the entire output.—North Powder News.

Building Sub-Station.
Work began this morning on the

electric light sub-station here. The building is located on lot 3 in block 26, brought from H. O. Gorham for a consideration of \$100, and will face on Center street. It will be 20x24 feet, frame, covered with brick sheeting, like that on the Riggs buildings. A brick or stone building will be put up in the spring. J. J. Clancy of La Grande is the contractor. The poles are up, the wires strung and the insulators which arrived last week, are being placed. North Powder will soon have all the light and power it needs.—North Powder News.
