ASSESSMENT UPON LADD CANYON SHAREHOLDERS NEWS ITEMS

No. 4452. Washington, D. C., Nov. 19, 1908. In the Matter of The Farmers & Traders' National Bank of La Grande, Oregon.

To All Whom It May Concern: Whereas, upon a proper accounting by the receiver heretofore appointed to collect the assets of "The Farmers & Traders' National Bank of La Grande, Oregon, and upon a valuation of the uncollected assets remaining in his hands, it appears to my satisfaction that in order to pay the debts of such association it is necessary to enforce the individual liability of the stockholders therefore to the extent hereinafter mentioned, as prescribed by Sections 5151 and 5234 of the Revised Statutes of the United States.

Now, therefore, by virtue of the authority vested in me by law, I do hereby make an assessment and requisition upon the shareholders of the said "The Farmers & Traders' National Bank of La Grande," for Sixty Thousand Dollars, to be paid by them ratably, on or before the nineteenth day of December, 1908; and I hereby make demand upon each and every one of them for One Hundred Dollars upon each and every share of the capital stock of said association held or owned by them, respectively, at the time of its failure; and I hereby direct Walter Neidner, the receiver heretofore appointed, to take all necessary proceedings, by suit or otherwise, to enforce to that extent the said individual liability of the said shareholders.

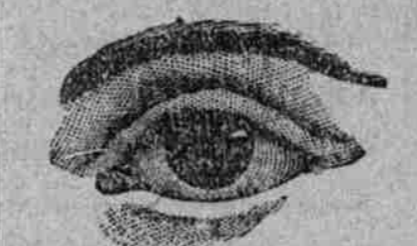

ROAD EXTENSION COSTLY.

Yet Builders Will Complete Pacific Coast Line With Money Left. New York, Nov. 24.—A man familiar with the details of the important new work of the St. Paul road, said today that the actual cost of the main line to the Pacific coast extension will probably be \$70,000,000, and not more than \$75,000,000. This includes also the acquisition of rights of way and terminal sites, instead of the parent company lacking money with which to complete the line, the work will be finished at a saving of at least \$25,000,000 over the original estimate.
