### TORNADO HAS DONE DAMAGE

Little Rock, Ark., Nov. 24.—Reports here today from the tornado-swept section lying northwest of here indicate that perhaps 50 were killed and 100 injured in the storm late yesterday. The stricken district is isolated with little means of communication, as most of the wires are down. The towns of Cravens and Barr are said to have been wiped out entirely. A strip of country 80 miles long and two miles wide is devastated.

#### An Irregular Path.

The path of the storm is hard to trace. It seems to have moved in an extremely irregular path. Many re-

ports of houses blown down and acres of trees being uprooted, have been received.

Each was fined \$10 this morning, but were sent to jail because they spent all the money for wine, the police say. They will serve six days each unless the fines are paid.
