Revolutionists Take Courage.
FORT AU FRANCE, Spain, Nov. 25.—The revolution against President Alcala was fanned to a brisk flame today through the announcement of the capture and execution of General Leone, minister of the interior, and the capture of the gunboat Crochant and a decision of the towns of Jerome and Aquin to side in with the rebels. New troops have been recruited by the government. Big quantities of ammunition have been rushed to the frontier.

Parker Jury Secured.
Portland, Nov. 25.—Twelve jurors to hear evidence in the case of the United States against James H. Parker, president of the First National Bank at Baker City, charged with perjury in connection with timber land claims, were selected by the United States district court today.

OFFICERS GUARD MR. ARCHBOLD

New York, Nov. 25.—Guarded on either side by a policeman, John D. Archbold, first vice-president of the Standard Oil company, walked across Bowling Green today from the Standard office to resume the testimony in the government suit. The policeman refused to allow any one to enter the elevator with Archbold, who was worried and nervous. The first part of the examination was concerned with the methods of determining the price of crude oil.

Ellis Goes East.

"I would like to stay here a month longer. The weather is much nicer here than it will be in Washington," declared Congressman W. R. Ellis this morning while discussing his departure for the Capital city, says the Pendleton East Oregonian. At 4:40 Tuesday evening Judge and Mrs. Ellis will leave for Washington in order to be there for the opening of congress a week from Monday. Upon his arrival at Washington Judge Ellis will at once take up several subjects that are of importance to this section. Among these are those relating to the experiment stations to be established by the government, the federal building for Pendleton, and other things.

Build Dual Vault.

Workmen are constructing a dual vault in the basement of the M. & M. company's warehouse. The lower portion of it will be included in the basement, while the upper half will be on a level with the ground floor.

Ship Driven to Haven.

Manila, Nov. 25.—The United States hospital ship Relief, reported five days overdue, took refuge in the harbor of Sorsogon in southern Luzon, according to a dispatch received from the medical officer of the ship.

TURKEY AT WHITE HOUSE

Washington, Nov. 25.—President Roosevelt and his family will enjoy their usual old-fashioned Thanksgiving dinner tomorrow. It will be a family affair, and formality will be dispensed with. As usual, the turkey which will have the place of honor on the table was supplied by Horace Vose, the Rhode Island man who has furnished the White House birds ever since Grant occupied the executive mansion.
