ACCIDENT NEAR COVE

LESTER JOHNSON AND CLARA HANCOCK INJURED.

Team Strikes Telephone Post Throwing Two Young Occupants to the Ground—Girl Sustains Broken Left Leg Below Knee—Boy Also Hurt—Girl in Hospital Here.

While returning to their homes near Cove last evening after having attended the football game in this city yesterday, Lester Johnson and Miss Clara Hancock, were seriously injured in a runaway that might have ended fatally.

Mr. Johnson, the 18-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. T. B. Johnson of Cove, and Miss Hancock, the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. William Hancock, also of Cove, were driving on the Cove road near the T. H. Schwelbe residence, when the team suddenly shied, striking a telephone post, throwing the occupants to the ground with terrific force.

The runaway team, without driver, passed another young couple, who, fearing an accident, turned around and upon reaching a point near the Schwelbe home, found Mr. Johnson and Miss Hancock lying in the road. They were assisted into Mr. Schwelbe's home and Dr. Mellor was summoned, who upon arriving, found that Miss Hancock suffered a fracture of both bones of the leg, below the knee, and that Mr. Johnson had a badly sprained knee. Mr. Johnson was taken to his home this morning and Miss Hancock was brought to the hospital, where she will remain until she is able to leave. The buggy was badly damaged.
