All-Eastern Oregon high school football teams are being picked by the coaches of Pendleton, La Grande and Baker City, and the result of the choice of Coach Wall of this city, is outlined above.

Coach Wall has undoubtedly made as careful a choice as can be made. He has taken many things into consideration and added them up to make his final selections.

In the back field, selections were made after much deliberation. Children of this city, and Jones of Baker, are conceded the places, though Children played at full with the local team.

Denha of Baker City, and the Pendleton quarter ran a close race, but Mr. Wall prefers the former.

Honorable Mention Due. Honorable mention is due several of them La Grande men. Walters of Cove, must be credited with it. Had he played in more of the big games, he unquestionably would have carried a half position.

Hamilton of La Grande, started out to win a halfback position but failed. His showing in the Baker City game, if equalled in the following ones, would also have given him an undisputed title.

Week of Prayer.
