BANQUET TO THE PLAYERS

Seldom before has a La Grande high school football team disbanded under more pleasant circumstances than that which characterized the event last Saturday night when the regulars of the squad were treated at the Model restaurant by the coaches, male teachers of the high school, and the newspaper fraternity of the city.

Impromptu speeches followed the dinner and brought forth several interesting talks. Captain Arlo Meyers reviewed the history of the past season in a clever manner, and Joe Ingie, captain-elect, gave a very optimistic prediction of what would be done next year, offering the pleasing information that La Grande is going to play teams from metropolitan cities next fall.

Joe Williamson talked from the standpoint of a player who carries no office in the organization. His speech was well received. The principal addresses of the evening were those delivered by Coach Wall, N. J. Mansager and H. J. Hockenberry. The first named spoke with feeling on the benefits derived by boys' characters in playing under a well-organized system of football. He spoke at some length and kept attention gripped by his words. Mr. Mansager, on "Does Football Pay," brought out weighty points of interest, affirming that it does pay, not from a financial standpoint always, but from more important viewpoints. The physical and mental training acquired by a player in action is conducive of education that is hard to duplicate on any other condition, said the speaker.

A. W. Nelson referred briefly to the differences in football as seen from the side lines by the football player and the public itself.

Token of Respect.
Mr. Hockenberry responded to Toastmaster Mickelson's call with a pre-presentation speech that carried well with the boys. He then presented to Mr. Wall, for the latter's conscientious work, a token of the esteem in which Wall is held by the players. A beautiful silver ring was in the little package that was handed to the coach. Wall responded briefly in a touching manner, giving voice to his deep appreciation.
