**Week of Prayer.**  
At a conference of representatives of seven lay brotherhoods in the United States held in Chicago, January 23, 1908, it was voted:

"That we recommend to our brotherhoods and to other organizations of men and to missionary boards throughout the world the observance of the week beginning with the Sunday following the last Thursday in November as a week of special prayer for the spread of Christ's kingdom among men throughout the world."

This week will be observed by St. Peter's church, beginning on Sunday and continuing throughout the week with the exception of Saturday. There will be service on the week days at 7:30 p. m. A cordial invitation is extended to all Christian people to join in these services, if their own churches are not observing the week. And as it represents a men's movement for men, it is hoped that Christian men will respond and co-operate.
