### BICYCLES BIG TOPIC

#### ONE ARREST ALREADY FOR VIOLATING LAWS.

New Spirit Animates Police Department Relative to Riding on Sidewalks—No New Ordinance Passed, But Will Strictly Enforce Existing Ordinances.

Recently a liberally signed petition was presented to the council, asking that the present ordinance be strictly enforced or an ordinance prohibiting the use of bicycles on the sidewalks be agreed to honor numbers and disband altogether. In compliance with the prayers of the petition an ordinance

was introduced last night, which if passed, would have ruled the wheels off the sidewalks in all parts of the city, but after a spirited discussion it was decided to leave things as they were, but literally enforce the ordinance now in force.

Hereafter violators need not be surprised if they are brought before the city recorder and fined. The fine ranges from \$5 to \$30.

There are two sides to the contention of those who want the wheels ruled off and those who desire the privilege to use the walks, and if the present ordinance is lived up to the rights of all will be preserved.

The ordinance provides that each and every wheel must be provided with a bell and upon meeting a passing pedestrian the rider must sound his bell and dismount. Wheels must also be provided with a lamp, which must be kept burning during darkness. When respected, this ordinance gives people on foot perfect safety and at the same time permits those who desire to ride their wheels outside of the fire limits. Newspaper carriers, messenger boys and those who are compelled to go distances to and from their work, are entitled to the use of the walks, provided they comply with the old ordinance which has been a law for many years. The discussion brought out the fact that the ordinance is to be enforced and undoubtedly it will require a few arrests before everybody may realize that the ordinance is being enforced.

#### An Arrest Already.

The first day since the new edict on the ordinance, saw an arrest, conviction and a fine. L. B. McClain, druggist at the Red Cross pharmacy, was "caught in the act" this morning, and arrested. He was riding his wheel past the city offices and was quietly run down and shackled by the police department. Before Recorder Cox he pleaded guilty and promptly paid a \$5 fine. This is the first. Who will be the next?

### NINE FILE ON LANDS

La Grande had a line-up last night that disbanded just as soon as the United States land office doors opened this morning. Nine made application for Hermiston desert land that is to be irrigated by the government irrigation project next spring, and the claims run from 19 to 40 acres, the size of the tract having been previously prescribed by the department according to the value of the land before application of water. The line-up contained 12 members, and it was formed last evening after the arrival of the eastbound passenger train, bringing applicants from Pendleton and Hermiston only. The land sought lies near Hermiston. For clear title to this land, the applicant pays the waterusers' rent of \$20 per acre, and \$1.50 a year for maintenance costs. Of little value now, but worth much money when water is once applied, the land is largely sought.

#### A Weak Line.

During the night hours close vigil was maintained by the dozen or so in line, but this morning the parties agreed to honor numbers and disbanded before 9 o'clock, only to reassemble again just as the doors opened.
