Ordinance No. 399, Series 1908.

An ordinance prohibiting the selling, exchanging or giving away of intoxicating liquors within the city of La Grande, Oregon.

The City of La Grande does ordain as follows:

Section 1. That any person who shall, after this ordinance goes into effect, sell, exchange or give away any intoxicating liquor of any kind, or in any way violate any of the provisions of this ordinance, within the city of La Grande, Oregon, shall upon conviction thereof before the recorder, be punished by a fine not less than \$50.00 nor more than \$300.00, or by imprisonment in the city jail for not less than 25 days nor more than 150 days. If any person shall be convicted a second time for violating any of the provisions of this ordinance, such person shall be punished for the second and each subsequent violation of this ordinance, by both such fine and imprisonment.

Sec. 2. The provisions of the foregoing section shall not be so construed as to prohibit the sale of wines to church officials for sacramental purposes, nor alcoholic stimulants as medicine in cases of actual sickness, but such stimulants shall only be sold upon the written prescription of a regular practicing physician who follow the practice of medicine as a principal and usual calling, dated and signed by him, and certified that he has personally examined the applicant, giving his name, and that he finds him actually sick, and in need of the stimulant prescribed as medicine; provided, that no person shall be permitted to sell more than once on the prescription, nor on a prescription which is not dated, signed and certified as above provided; provided further, that every person selling such stimulant upon the prescription herein provided for, shall cancel such prescription by endorsing thereon the words "Cancelled" and the date of cancellation, and shall file the same away.

But nothing in this ordinance shall be construed to prevent one registered pharmacist selling such alcoholic liquors to another registered pharmacist.

Sec. 3. This ordinance shall be published in one issue of the La Grande Evening Observer, and after its approval by the mayor be in full force and effect on and after the 4th day of January, 1909.

Passed by the common council on the 3rd day of December, 1908, by seven members voting therefor.
