OFFICIALS EXPLAIN HUNTINGTON CUT-OFF

In an official communication to the Lewiston Herald, the Union Pacific officials speak as follows on the Huntington-Lewiston cut-off:

"At the present time the Oregon Short Line is constructing a new branch from Huntington, Ore., down the valley of the Snake river, designed eventually to extend to Lewiston, connecting there with the Oregon Railroad & Navigation company, and probably become a through trans-continental line.

"The O. R. & N. is now making an extension of its branch from Elgin, Ore., to Joseph, a distance of 63 miles. After completion this line will tap an exceptionally rich agricultural section.

"The line of the O. R. & N. between Huntington and Portland presents some of the most difficult operating problems on the Harriman system.
