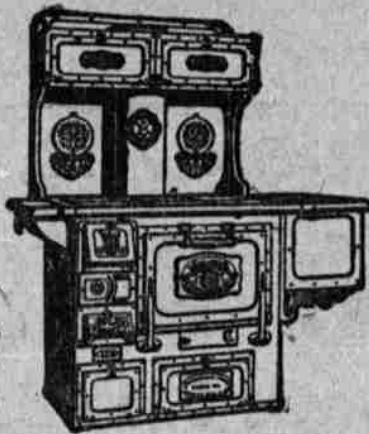

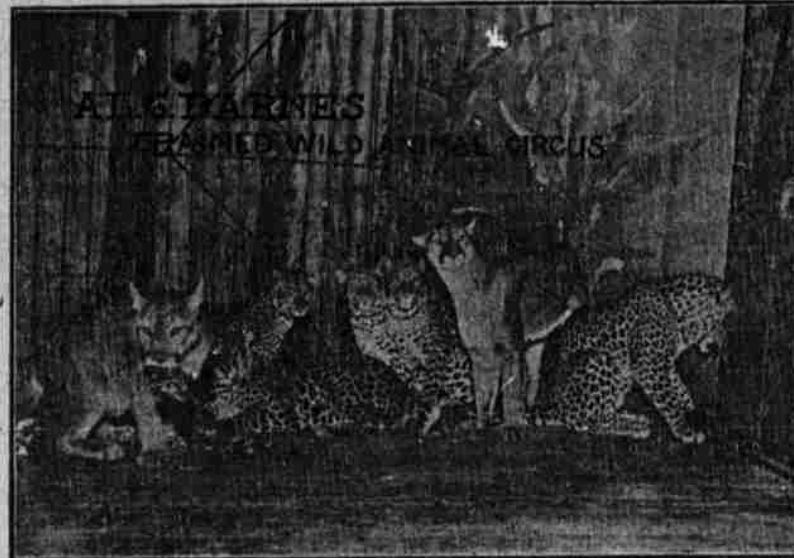

Port au Prince, Hayti, Dec. 4.—Unless General Simon assumes charge of affairs in Hayti anarchy is likely to prevail for a long time. The advance guards of Simon's army entered the city at daybreak. Simon is expected some time today.

Flays Mayor Dahlman.
Omaha, Neb., Dec. 4.—The grand jury in a report today submitted to the court, branded Mayor James C. Dahlman and other city officials as "absolutely without regard for their official duties and making no attempt to enforce the laws." The report says: "The officials frankly admit

they have no conception of their duties. They serve people neither honestly nor ably." For many years Dahlman has been the leader of democratic politics of the state. He is a member of the national democratic campaign committee and has been Bryan's leading adviser.

Oregon Classes Choose Captains.
University of Oregon, Eugene, Dec. 4.—A meeting of all track men was held last night to elect captains for the class cross-country teams. William Woods, who took second place in the open cross-country run last year, was chosen to lead the seniors, and Chester Downs, who finished last year's race right behind Woods, was elected captain of the sophomore team. Charles Reynolds was chosen by the freshmen. The junior election was postponed. The cross-country race is scheduled for December 19. The distance men have done road work all fall, and are in fair condition. The game of lacrosse, which Trainer Hayward has introduced, is proving popular with the students, and although no regular teams have been made up yet, many men are out daily endeavoring to master its intricacies.
