ONE MAN PLACED ON TEAM BY BAKER COACH

All Eastern Oregon Team.
Finley, 155, center, Baker City.
Graham, 230, left guard, Pendleton.

The Baker City high school football team coach has picked an all-eastern Oregon football team, as did Coach J. F. Wall of this city a few days ago. La Grande is honored with but one man in the line-up but others are given favorable mention. In many respects, the article explaining the choice is very fair, and ably compiled. Excerpts from the write-up refers to La Grande players, follow, as lack of space forbids printing the long but interesting article:

For center the two leading candidates are Bean of La Grande and Finley of Baker. Bean has the reputation of being a steady passer, quick at charging and able to make tackles from his position, but first choice goes to Finley for the reason that he is a more experienced player, able to cooperate more splendidly with his guards and on the offense, works very well with his quarter, takes good care of his opponent and can always make a good pass for the punts and open play variations.

There are four strong players for the guard position, Graham and Devine of Pendleton, Hindman of Baker and Williams of La Grande. Williams is a remarkable player considering that he is but 16 years of age and Hindman is at least equal to the best players in the game but Graham of Pendleton, who weighs 230 pounds, should be given the place at right guard because of his great weight and strength entitles him to special consideration for the peculiar duties of the place.

Ingles for Tackle.
Ingles of La Grande was given almost unanimous choice for right tackle by the coaches and though he weighs only 155 pounds is a hard, aggressive player, able to hold his own in the line and can be relied on to carry the ball in short end runs from his position.

Other players of good promise are Childers of La Grande, and White and Finch of Baker. These are all young men at the game but have shown marked ability and Finch and Childers compare favorably with Baker in the punting department.

The average weight of this team is 168 pounds, the line is strong enough to be capable of stone-wall defense, and the back field is admirably adapted for either the heavy work of straight football or the speedy play of the open form of work.

There is much difference of opinion as to who should fill the three back field positions. James F. Wall of La Grande, suggests that the fullbacks of Baker, Pendleton and La Grande

be given the honor and it is certain that for the old style of play, Childers and Jones as halfbacks, and Baker as fullback would prove to be a formidable aggregation, as they are each powerful men and their great strength would enable them to grind to pieces most any line in front of them. However, the requirements of the modern game call for two speedy men at half back and a strong player and good interference runner for fullback. Therefore, Smith of Ontario, who is very fast, with weight enough to plunge well, is given the place at left half and Niles of Weston, should fill the other place.

The Weston team relied almost altogether on open play and Niles proved himself to be the most dangerous back in the game in a broken field. He was responsible for the score against Baker on Thanksgiving day, and seems to be clearly entitled to his place over Walters, the speedy half on the Cove team.

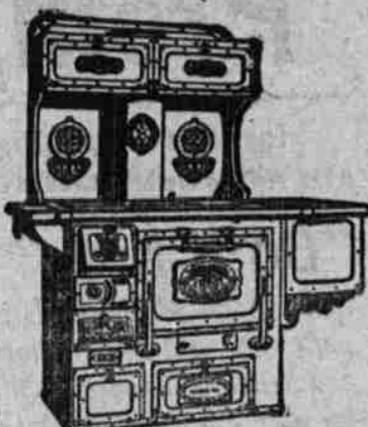
