in exemplary youth. The Norden youth claims to be a little less than 16 years of age, and will undoubtedly be sent to the reform school. As a matter of fact he will find there a better home, perhaps, than he has ever known, as from his own story he was sent out to shift for himself when he was but 10 years of age and has been "sort o' drifting along ever since." He says he has worked at all sorts of work since then, sometimes in a box factory and again on the farm or shining shoes. As evidence of the fact that he has served time in a box factory he exhibits a mutilated hand. The last two fingers are missing. As evidence that he has had to do with horses, is a great scar between his eyes where he says he was kicked by a colt. His story is a hard one. Like the story of most of the boys who have gone wrong, it shows that he home was not what it should have been. His mother died when he was 3 years of age, and at the age of 10 his stepmother thought that it was time for him to begin to earn his own living. He says he is willing to go to the reform school, where he hopes to be able to learn a trade and then be able to earn an honest living.

### Another Case.

Ira Newman is also implicated, but at the present time there does not seem to be any particular evidence against him, and unless something more is developed at the trial tomorrow morning he will be discharged.

In yesterday's report of this case the name of Ira Moon was substituted for that of Newman. The Moon boys is in no way connected with the affair and his name should have not been used. Young Moon bears a good reputation and we hope our readers will realize that his character is untarnished.

### JURY TAKES STROLL.

Minnick Jury Inspects Earmarks on Calves Alleged Stolen.

The wheels of justice are grinding quietly but effectively at the circuit court today. The case of John Minnick, charged with the larceny of a couple of heifer calves from William Ogden, is still occupying the attention of Judge Knowles, District Attorney Ivanhoe and Attorney Leroy Lomax, and 12 jurymen today. At 1 o'clock the attorneys were addressing the jury and the case will undoubtedly go to the jury some time this afternoon.

Several other cases are set for the latter part of the week, but tomorrow the court will listen to the argument in several motions and some minor pleadings.
