from placid. There is a rumor of a severe clash, bordering on fistcuffs between two jurors, spreading about the building. It is understood several jurors are vigorously demanding some decision be reached in view of the enormous cost of the trial.

Talk of bribery is rife. It is even reported that the prosecution expects one juror to hold out for Ruef, since receiving certain information the last days of the trial. A big crowd is in the court room awaiting the verdict.

Every indication points to a disagreement. Detective Burns is already making preparations to investigate the jurors holding out. It is understood a failure of the jury to report before noon led the prosecution abandon hope of conviction.

Political Treasurer Gone.

Toledo, O., Dec. 10.—John Mulholland, and all the state funds of the independence league are reported missing today. Mulholland was national committeeman of Ohio for the Hearst party. He had in his keeping all the funds and records. H. W. Madge, the party's state secretary, is embarrassed because he cannot pay bills the party contracted.

Mountain Hotel Destroyed.

Seattle, Dec. 10.—Fire last night totally destroyed the magnificent Scenic Hot Springs hotel, on the Great Northern road, in the Cascade mountains. W. Whitsett, of Anacortes, a guest, jumped from a two-story window, sustaining a dislocated shoulder. Manager Prosser was slightly burned while trying to save valuables. The origin of the fire is a mystery. The hotel cost \$50,000.

THIRTY INJURED.

Train Running 35 Miles an Hour When Accident Occurs.

Fargo, N. D., Dec. 10.—Thirty passengers were injured and a man reported to have bled to death as the result of a wreck of the North Coast Limited on the Northern Pacific railroad, one mile east of McKenzie last night. Six coaches were overturned when the train was running 35 miles an hour. Spreading rails are said to have been the cause of the wreck.

ROBBERS FAIL TO GET THE MONEY

PASSENGER TRAIN HELD UP NEAR SPOKANE LAST NIGHT.

Robbers Who Did It Said to Be Ex-Convicts From Walla Walla—Failed to Get Car Containing Big Sum of Money—Stole the Registered Mail.

Seattle, Dec. 10.—That the three bandits who held up a Great Northern passenger train at Hillyard, near Spokane, at midnight, were three ex-convicts who planned to loot the Oriental Limited the night of December 2, is the opinion of a Walla Walla penitentiary guard, who saw the trio on a Seattle street two days ago.

The bandits stopped the train and ordered the fireman to cut the express car containing a shipment of \$20,000 from Spokane, from the rest of the train. The fireman failed to obey instructions. The bandits went away with the engine and only two mail cars. They stole the registered mail.

Investigate Poisoning.

San Francisco, Dec. 10.—While the board of health will continue to investigate today into the cause of the poisoning of scores of citizens who attended the launching of the collier Prometheus at Vallejo, the entertainment committee of Vallejo tonight begins an inquiry to fix the blame for furnishing food that is believed to have caused widespread sickness.

Twenty-four additional cases of ptomaine poisoning were reported yesterday afternoon and last night at Vallejo. Mrs. William Cantrali, Robert Cleghorn, Jr., are seriously ill. Experiments on guinea pigs will be made and the effects of different foods served will be noted.
