BAKER CONGRESS AN IMPORTANT EVENT

GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS SCHEDULED TO SPEAK.

When Irrigation Congress Convenes in Baker City, Many Important Speakers Will Be on Hand.

Baker City, Dec. 11.—The Irrigation congress which meets in this city next Tuesday, December 15, is to be a meeting of importance to the entire portion of Oregon that profits by irrigation.

Hon. Stephen A. Lowell, of Pendleton, will address the assembly on "The Conservation Movement." A. P. Stover of the United States department of agriculture, has been selected to talk on "Irrigation in Western Oregon," and E. T. Allen, chief inspector of the forest service, will discuss "Forestry."

J. C. Steyens, of the United States geological survey, is on the program for a review on "Hydrographic Survey and State Co-operation." Dr. J. H. Withycombe of Oregon's experiment station, will tell of "Irrigation as a Factor in Developing Oregon."

J. A. Smith, of the Baker Irrigation company, will address the congress on "Irrigation Development and Future Possibilities in Baker County." Supervising Engineer of the Reclamation Service D. C. Henry, is on the program for a talk on "The Work of the Reclamation Service in Oregon."

"Comparison of the Wyoming and Idaho Systems of Adjudicating Water Rights" is the subject assigned to Clarence J. Johnston of Wyoming. James H. Lewis, state engineer, will discuss "Investments Discouraged Through Inadequacy of Present Water Laws." President J. W. Kerr, of the Oregon Agricultural college, will handle the subject, "Need of Experimental Farms in Various Parts of the State."

In addition to the above list of prominent speakers representatives of the forestry and irrigation departments of the government will be present with lantern slides to illustrate work that is being done. Talks will be made by local people.
