### WANTS MORE PAY.

McDonald's Attorneys File Answer in O. R. & N. Injunction Suit.

The attorneys for Hector McDonald recently filed an answer to the injunction suit brought by the O. R. & N. at the time Mr. McDonald attempted to stop the laying of the track through his land in Lower valley, relates the Enterprise News-Record. The answer claims the transfer of the land to the O. R. & N. became void because the railroad was not completed within two years, and says all work was abandoned on the road at the time of the financial panic a year ago. It says also the land is worth \$1000, no part of which has been paid since the alleged forfeiture.

This, in substance, is claiming \$1000 compensation for the land in addition to the \$600 in the deed, and which the company has already paid Mr. McDonald. The company, of course, will fight the claim to the ends, as to allow it would be an invitation for all from whom it bought right of way, to bring suit for additional pay for their land.
