#### CONDUCTORS SHIFTED.

Several Changes in Conductors on O. R. & N. Last Week.

A noticeable shifting of conductors has been going on in the Oregon Railroad & Navigation circles the last week. Those to be changed are F. L. Coykendall, C. H. Norris, J. C. Gulling and James Connors. Mr. Coykendall, the oldest passenger conductor on the main line, has been transferred from the Pendleton-Huntington run to the Pendleton-Portland run. C. H. Norris, formerly of La Grande, is again on the Pendleton-Huntington run, while J. C. Gulling has taken his place on the Pilot Rock run. Temporarily at least, James Connors is taking Gulling's place on the La Grande-Joseph run. Mr. Connors went out with his first train this morning. He has been on work train service in Wallowa county all summer.

#### HENDRICK TO THE DALLES.

Plano Tuner Leaves La Grande for the Columbia River Town.

Prof. George Hendrick, the piano tuner, has bought residence property at The Dalles and is now making that city his home. His family has joined him there. Besides being a first-class piano tuner, Prof. Hendrick has proved to be a band and orchestra leader of more than ordinary ability. He brought both the La Grande Concert band and the Steward opera house orchestra up to playing standard works during the last five years in which he made his home in La Grande.

#### Million Dollar Fruit Crop.

Positive proof of the immensity into which the fruit and vegetable industry of the Walla Walla valley is growing is given in figures compiled by County Fruit Inspector C. L. Whitney, from records in the several freight offices of the city Saturday, says the Walla Walla Union.

According to the compilation of Mr. Whitney, there was in the neighborhood of \$1,000,000 worth of fruits and vegetables shipped from Walla Walla, exclusive of Milton and Freewater and the adjacent towns, since the opening of the season early last spring. In all 1000 carloads have been shipped, being divided among vegetables, small fruits, peaches, apples, pears and prunes.

This amount is probably not more than half the total yield of the vegetable and fruit productions of the

Walla Walla valley. Milton alone shipped several hundred carloads of fruit, beside what was sent from Dayton, Waitsburg and other small towns. Figuring it thus, the entire fruit and vegetable yield of the Walla Walla valley for the year will total, in round numbers, \$1,000,000.

#### To Repay Damage.

Desiring to know what resources he could command to assist in reimbursing the losers in the defunct Farmers & Traders' bank at La Grande, which he wrecked, J. W. Scriber, formerly cashier of that institution, stopped in Pendleton Saturday evening in conference with W. J. Furnish of this city, who is one of his bondsmen. Scriber is now out on \$40,000 bonds by which he is held to the federal grand jury, and is making every possible attempt to reimburse the losers in the bank. Pendleton East Oregonian.

#### Montana Poultry Show.

Butte, Mont., Dec. 15.—Montana's first big state poultry show was opened here today and has attracted entries from all over the northwest. The poultry industry is rapidly coming to the front in this section and much interest has been aroused by the show. The management will award \$500 in gold medals, in addition to hundreds of other premiums.
