Yeggmen at Freewater.
Freewater, Dec. 16.—Yeggmen entered the residence of Mrs. A. A. Brady in Railroad addition to this city Monday night, opening the trunks of William and Albert James and that belonging to Mrs. Brady herself, securing from the latter \$128 in coin. These coins are of especial value on account of their age. They were highly prized by Mrs. Brady and their loss is of no small proportions to the owner.
