Favors Irrigation.

W. E. Anderson, manager of the Im-
bler Hardware company, was a La
Grande visitor this morning. Mr. An-
derson is a firm believer in the irri-
gation project and states that he firm-
ly believes that once this valley se-
cures the proper irrigation facilities
it will be able to sustain a population
of fully 75,000. He has had experi-
ence with agriculture under irrigation
and knows whereof he speaks. He
reports the little town of Imbler as
prospering, but says that if there was
a good-sized canal running along the
Sandridge Imbler would surely become
a close rival to La Grande.

AWAIT FINAL PAPERS.

U. S. N. Bank Will Open as Soon as Of-
ficial Documents come.

The exact date of swinging open the
doors of the United States National
bank in this city, depends on the time
of arrival from Washington, D. C., of
certificates and other necessary docu-
ments. The time is still in doubt, but

roughly guessed at by the officers of
the bank, at anywhere between the
first and fifteenth of the month. The
final papers from the comptroller of
the currency are all that will retard
the opening after January 2.

Demonstrate New Machine.

strument which perfects telephone
and supersedes the phonograph and
widens the field of telegraphy. The
human voice from a telephone or the

without indentation on the receiving
surface, but can be removed with a
magnet at will. It is said to be a great
instrument and can be seen after to-
morrow for three days at the Cigar
store, where the representative will
demonstrate the workings to anyone
interested.
