WORK ON WAPATO PROJECT.

Surveyors Begin Preliminary Examination of the Country.

A Toppenish, Wash., dispatch says: Surveyors of the reclamation service have begun work here on the Wapato irrigation project. Several men from the surveying camps of the Teton project have within the week been brought here for an indefinite stay, and expect to be at work in this section all winter.

The work to be done now is preliminary examination of the surface of the country, a sort of topographical survey, and will be followed by the preliminary surveys of the project proper. The reclamation service has opened an office in the Williams building, the office force having been recruited from projects as far east as the Dakotas.

The Wapato project is similar to the Sunnyside project and will, if present plans are followed, embrace a tract of 150,000 acres on the southwest side of the Yakima river, extending west to the foothills and south to Alfalfa and below.

The main canal will be many miles in extent and will take water from the Yakima river. The intake will be at a point just below the Union gap.
