WORK ON WAPATO PROJECT.

Surveyors Begin Preliminary Examin ation of the Country.

A Toppenish, Wash., dispatch says Surveyors of the reclamation service we begun work here on the Wapato rigation project. Several men from the surveying camps of the Tieton project have within the week been brought here for an indefinite stay, and expect to be at work in this section all winter.

liminary examination of the surface preliminary surveys of the project proper. The reclamation service has opened an office in the Williams buildng, the office force having been recriuted from projects as far east as the Dekotas.

The Wapato project is similar to the Sunnyside project and will, if present plans are followed, embrace tract of 150,000 acres on the southwest side of the Yakima river, extending west to the foothills and south to Alfalfa and below.

The main canal will be many miles in extent and will take water from the Yakima river. The intake will be at a point just below the Union gap.
