JOSEPH IS WOOL CENTER

OVER HALF WALLOWA'S WOOL CLIP FOR JOSEPH.

Organization of Joseph Warehouse Company a Great Commercial Will Be Built for Next Year's Clip.

Joseph, Ore., Jan. 2.—(Special).—The organization of the Joseph Warehouse company corporation was effected here Thursday evening. The capital stock subscribed is over \$1000, and over \$3000 of it was represented in person at the meeting. The citizens and business men of Joseph are the stockholders, it being the intention to have but the one warehouse here, all the of the people co-operating in this effort to accommodate the shippers and woolgrowers without the expenditure of a dollar by those interests. The construction of a large warehouse will start immediately, and will be completed and a wool baler installed in time to accommodate this season's wool clip. At this meeting written agreements representing over half the wool clip of Wallowa county were read, signing the wool to Joseph, which will mean to this co-operative warehouse run by Joseph citizens. The officers elected were: Wade Stier, president; E. T. Schieur, vice president; A. Wurzweller, secretary; W. D. McCully, treasurer, and Edward Berland, J. H. Thompson, George Touser and L. E. Caviness, with the president, directors.

OBITUARY.

Death of S. M. Hiatt Ends Life of Strenuous Pioneer.

The funeral of the late Samuel M. Hiatt was held yesterday from the L. D. S. tabernacle in this city. Mr. Hiatt died at Hermiston last week. The deceased was born in Indiana on January 19, 1833. He came west in 1850 and joined the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints in Utah a year later. He lived in that state until 1880, when he moved to Fremont county, Idaho. The same year he was one of the pioneers who built up the upper Snake river country. In 1901 he moved to Oregon and had since made his home in the Grande Ronde valley. He is survived by a wife, seven sons and one daughter. When death in the form of peritonitis overtook him he was at Hermiston, and his body was shipped to La Grande yesterday morning for interment. C. J. Black and F. S. Bramwell spoke the funeral sermon.

VOTERS PROD DIRECTORS.

Joseph Taxpayers More Ambitious Than the School Directors.

Joseph, Ore., Jan. 2.—(Special).—At the special school meeting here Tuesday to vote a special school tax, the directors recommended a tax of four mills, but the voters raised it to six and instructed the directors to increase the number of teachers by two the coming season, and also had a committee appointed to act with the directors in taking immediate steps for a new brick school building, to be built this coming summer.
