RAMSEY STAYS IN PORTLAND.

Prominent Rector of Portland Church Resigns and Returns.

Much surprise was expressed yesterday at the services in St. Stephen's pro-Cathedral when Bishop Scadding announced that Rev. H. M. Ramsey (son of Attorney W. M. Ramsey of La Grande), rector of the parish, had resigned but had been induced by him and the members of the vestry to reconsider his decision and had finally decided to remain with the parish, provided he was accorded more general support on the part of the people in the way of attendance at the services and a larger interest in the work of the parish and diocese.

Rev. Mr. Ramsey's resignation at this time is all the more remarkable says the Portland Oregon, by reason of the fact that St. Stephen's is considered to be one of the most progressive churches in the diocese. Its membership has steadily increased and only recently the church building was enlarged and improved. In the absence of Mr. Ramsey, Bishop Scadding conducted the services yesterday and in speaking of the rector's action referred to the various undertakings which have been successfully carried out by Mr. Ramsey, of his ability as a preacher and organizer, and urged the parishioners to accord their vicar hearty co-operation.
