AMUSEMENT GALORE AT LOCAL THEATRES

The Great Divide : : : Gilbert Sisters

"The Great Divide."

"The Great Divide," which will be presented here at the Steward on Saturday, January 16, by Mr. Henry Miller, is being translated into French, German, Italian and Spanish, and Mr. Miller has begun arrangements for its presentation in Paris, Berlin, Rome and Madrid, in addition to his own appearance in the play in London next spring. All the adaptations are being made by the actor-manager's elder son, Gilbert H. Miller.

Mr. Miller has had many offers for the rights of "The Great Divide" in the Continental countries, but he has retained them, just as he has the London rights, and he, with associates, will be sole owners and managers of all the productions made. Prominent producers in the different cities will be in charge of local details. Mr. Miller will rehearse each company personally. He is negotiating with a leading American couple who are familiar with the German and French languages, to play the roles of Stephen Ghent and Ruth Jordan, in Paris and Berlin, respectively. The remaining members of the companies will be native French and German, and the Rome and Madrid productions will be made with all Italian and Spanish casts.

This will be the first time in history that a reigning New York theatrical success has been adapted especially for presentation in Spain and Italy. The four productions will be made next autumn, Mr. Miller giving them his personal attention after his London engagement in "The Great Divide," which begins May 1.

"Shore Acres" Coming.

"Shore Acres," the great rural play written by James A. Herne, is scheduled to be presented for the entertainment and amusement of local theatergoers at the Steward Wednesday, January 27. This is without doubt the best of all the pastoral plays that have ever been placed before American theatergoers. Archie Boyd, the great character actor, who for several years played Joshua Whitcomb in Denman Thompson's play of the "Old Homestead," is again playing the part of Nathaniel Berry, the part that was created by Mr. Herne himself. The youngest daughter of the late Mr. Herne is in the company this season, and she is described as being a young actress of unusual ability. The scenery is all new, thus making a most effective revival of Mr. Herne's masterpiece.

First Vaudeville.

The first presentation of vaudeville at the Pastime theater last evening was largely attended and if the pleased expression on the faces of the patrons as they left the playhouse is a criterion they will be back for the next change. Ross and Shaw, vaudeville stars in the instrumental line, made themselves popular with the audiences right off the bat. They are adepts on every instrument they pick up. They are here for all week. Don't overlook the opportunity of seeing them. The films are new stuff, less than 10 days old, and pleased the house. The stage curtain will be ready in a week.

Opened Second Week.

The Gilbert Sisters and Brott and Mason opened the second week of their engagement at the Scenic last evening with new and classy stunts. They will be here for the rest of the week introducing new numbers from time to time. The moving pictures at the Scenic are up to snuff. Great crowds thronged the doors last evening trying to get a glimpse of the dual teams at the Scenic theater.
