Horrors! Few Free Seeds.

Washington, Jan. 6.—Senator Borah and Congressman Cornhassel, and other solons from the bucolic districts, are up in arms because of the reduction that has been made in the amount of free seeds to be distributed among their constituents this year. Free seeds are among the most valuable arguments used by congressmen for impressing the hostility of their reelection upon rural voters, and the loss of even a portion of this perquisite is viewed with alarm.

Owing to the high price of seeds, resulting from a crop shortage, each congressman will have only 10,000 packages of vegetable seeds to distribute among his constituents. In recent years the quota of each member has been 12,500 packages. The quota of flower seeds, 500 packages, remains the same.

An effort will undoubtedly be made to have the appropriation increased, so as to make up the deficiency. This will be opposed by Representative Weeks and other conservative members. Mr. Weeks invariably votes against free seeds. He says he would not object if he had no seeds to distribute, and he believes the government might as well give pianos to the

constituents of congressmen as garden seed.
