**SHIPMENT OF BIG APPLE ORDER RETARDED.**  
Storm Interferes With Prompt Shipment of 20 Carloads of Apples—Exchanges Toot Horns Loudly for the Grande Ronde and Its Apples, This Week.

The severe storm and sudden cold snap which has gripped the city of La Grande, has been a menace to prompt shipment of cars in the 20-car lot recently purchased by the Ramsey-Oldenberg company in the vicinity of La Grande. Just prior to the breaking of the storm the company was ready to ship out the first carload, but during the past few days there has been nothing for the firm to do but await patiently the arrival of favorable shipping weather.

The purchase of this bulk of apples at the fancy prices quoted, has been the subject of newspaper comment from Boise to Seattle, and few papers there are which have not either republished the original Observer item chronicling the purchase, or used a synopsis of it in some way. In this way, Grande Ronde and its apples have been tooted and read about more than any other community in the Pacific northwest. This is not supposition by any means, but an actual fact, based on exchange table evidence.
