**Twenty Below at Pendleton.**  
Last night the thermometer took another sudden tumble and during the night it came within one degree of being as cold as Saturday night, says Tuesday's Pendleton East Oregonian. At the residence of H. F. Johnson, where the official government thermometer is stationed, the mercury registered 20 degrees below during the night. The maximum temperature yesterday was four above zero, while today it has ranged much lower than that. For tonight the weather bureau has predicted a more moderate temperature, but more snow is also predicted.
