12.5 MILL TAX LEVIED

BASEMENT TO WALLOWA COURT HOUSE READY.

Total Tax Levy in Wallowa is 12.5 Mills—County Seal Bounty Tax is 1.—Contractor Given First Payment for Construction of New Court House.

Joseph, Ore., Jan. 16.—(Special).—The county court of Wallowa county has levied a tax as follows:

In addition to this the cities of Wallowa and Enterprise have levied a 10-mill city tax. Joseph has levied 7, and Lostine, 3 mills.
Wallowa county is constructing a county court house at Enterprise, and the contractor has been allowed \$1500 on his contract, the basement having been completed.

WESTON NORMAL TEAM TO TOUR THIS SECTION.

Weston Normal Five Will Initiate Basketball in This City of the Snappy Kind, With High School—Other Games Stated—Need of Conference Again Evident.

The Weston Normal basketball quintet will play the local high school five in this city on February 13, according to arrangements made between the Weston manager and Manager Hamilton of the high school. The teachers will be touring eastern Oregon that week.

In anticipation of opening the real basketball season this year with a snappy game, hard practice will be indulged in between now and the date of the game. The team which steps on the floor for that contest will not be a class organization, but the best of each of the teams that have already this season appeared before public eye. The race for places will be extremely warm, as it has been demonstrated in early games this winter that there are about two men equally fit to hold down each place. This is especially true in the goal throwing half of the floor. The men will be worked out to the best advantage during the time allowed the teams to practice and on the eve of the battle the line-up will be announced.

Means Fast Game.
The Normalites are always a snappy and agile aggregation. That neither team will have an easy task at hand is very easily promised. The visitors will play Baker City, Ontario and Pendleton during the tour, with the result that the outcome of the trip will determine, by dope at least, the relative strength of the different teams in this section of the state.

Need of Conference.
Here again is looming up the difficulty of not having a conference to regulate the awards of championships in basketball, as well as other sports in the high school athletic curriculum. It is hardly likely that the teams will all meet each other, and the championship will undoubtedly be as undecided when the season is over as it is now. It is to be hoped that another year is not to go by without the formation of such a conference.

Southern Team Wanted Game.
The clever Los Angeles club team that is touring Washington and Oregon, wanted a game with the high school in this city tonight, but on account of the short notice no contest could be arranged. It would be a treat to see the southern players in action, as they have made a clean-sweep victory wherever they have played thus far.

The M. I. A. and Cove teams are slated to play the locals at some near-by date.
