MILES OF TRACK WASHED

Pendleton, Jan. 21.—M. J. Buckley, general superintendent of the O. R. & N., with a crew of 150 track men, is working between Pendleton and Adams today endeavoring to repair the track washed out by the flood in Wild Horse in hopes of getting trains through from this city to Walla Walla and releasing the 100 passengers who are storm blocked in this city.

Superintendent Buckley arrived from Portland last evening and took out the work train this morning. In the 13 miles of track between this city and Adams reports show 6667 feet washed out. This is divided among many washouts of no great size, but as all the work must be done from one end the repairs are slow.

It was announced this afternoon that the railroad would probably be able to get its trains through to Walla Walla tomorrow.

Bad Conditions Near Wallula.
Between Walla Walla and Wallula the road is in bad shape and many small sections have gone out in the floods.

By rushing the repairs on the Juniper bridge, where Cold Springs canyon empties into the Columbia river,

the road has it in good shape for crossing, but the Spokane line is blocked just a trifle west by a slide which the company is clearing up as rapidly as possible.

On the Northern Pacific it was stated today that there was no train connection on their line and in all probability it would be fully a week if not 10 days before the damage could be repaired and trains sent through to Wallula.

Service Improving.
Walla Walla, Jan. 21.—Train service to and from the city, which was practically at a standstill Tuesday, was somewhat improved yesterday by the repairing of the Northern Pacific tracks between here and Pasco. A special train left the city at 1:30 for Pasco, no promises being made by the company regarding progress from that point, although it was expected passengers going to Portland could reach their destination. A train reached this city from Pasco about 4:30 this afternoon.

CONFERENCE TO BE HELD

PENDLETON SCHOOL FACULTY TO HOLD CONFERENCE.

Wheat Town Takes the Initiative in Forming What La Grande High School Athletes Want—Date of Meeting is Undecided.

Success seems about to crown the efforts of eastern Oregon high school athletes to organize an athletic conference. Local students will read with delight, the following announcement of the Pendleton Tribune:

"At a faculty meeting of the Pendleton high school yesterday it was decided to call a conference of the high schools of eastern Oregon, to be held in this city, at a date to be selected later. The date will be arranged so that it will be convenient for the meeting and everybody can attend without danger of floods and blizzards. The object of this conference will be to formulate an association similar to the high school organizations now existing in Washington and western Oregon. These organizations have established a standard of eligibility for athletics and also for literary contests. It can be definitely determined then where championships really belong among high school students and also establishes regulations and standards so that unnecessary disputes and contentions can be eliminated. The organization will put high school contests in eastern Oregon on a satisfactory basis and will have a tendency to create enthusiasm and ambition among the student bodies."
It was La Grande's move originally, but no action being taken at the opportune time, Pendleton took it, much to her credit. La Grande was the logical place for the conference to
