LODGES TO BUILD.

Masons and Knights of Pythias to Put
Up Fine Building.

Wallowa, Jan. 21.—The Masonic and
Knights of Pythias lodges are con-
templating erecting a fraternal tem-
ple this coming summer. Standley
lodge No. 113, A. F. & A. M., has over
\$5000 available as a building fund, it
having been enriched by a bequest of
\$5500 in the will of the late J. C.
Standley. The K. of P. has over \$3000
in its building fund, so the financial
part is in excellent shape. Negotia-
tions are being made with the Wal-
lowa Mercantile company, which is
planning to erect a fine stone building
on the site of its present store room
and on its vacant lot immediately west.
This would give the company one of
the largest and finest mercantile rooms
in the county, and the lodges would
own the entire second story, giving
them a space of 58x100 feet to divide
up into lodge room, banquet hall,
kitchen, dressing and ante-rooms.

How to Prepare a Husband.

A good many husbands are utterly
spilled in the cooking. Some women
set them constantly in hot water;
others let them freeze by carelessness
and indifference. Some keep them in
a pickle all their lives. It is not rea-
sonable to suppose that any husband
can be tender and appetizing treated
in this way, but they are really deli-
cious when properly prepared. In se-
lecting your husband you should not
be guided by the silvery appearance,
as in buying mackerel, nor by the
golden tint, as in picking salmon. Be
sure to select him yourself, as tastes
differ. Do not go to market for him.
The best are always brought to your
door. But it is far better to have none
unless you will patiently learn how to
cook him.

A preserving kettle of the finest por-
celain is best; but if you have nothing
but an earthen pipkin, it will do, with
care. See that the linen in which you

wrap him is nicely washed and mend-
ed, with the required number of but-
tons and strings securely sewed on.
Tie him in the kettle by a strong
comfort cord. The duty cord is break-
able and apt to let him fly out of
the kettle and become burnt and crusty
on the edge. Of course, you know
that, like a crab or lobster, you have
to cook him alive. Set him near a
clear, steady fire of love, neatness and
cheerfulness. If he sputters and fiz-
zles, do not be anxious. Some do this
until they are quite done. Add a little
sugar in the form of what confection-
ers call kisses, but no vinegar or pep-
per on any account. A little spice will
improve him, but it must be used with
judgment. Do not stick any sharp in-
struments into him to see if he is be-
coming tender. Stir gently, watching
the while lest he lie too flat and too
close to the kettle, and so become
flabby.

If thus treated you will find him dig-
estible, agreeing nicely with you and
the children. He will keep as long as
you like, unless you become careless
and set him in too cold a place.—Ethel
Weiland.

Find Rich Body of Ore.

A telephone message was received
from the Uncle Dan mine in the Virtue
district, yesterday afternoon, stating
that a large body of ore had been en-
countered in that property, says the
Baker Democrat. In fact, it is one of
the largest deposits of ore yet un-
covered in the Uncle Dan, being over 10
feet wide at the point where cross-cut.
Much of the ore is of high grade char-
acter, while all of its seems to be of
good milling grade. The mine is be-
ing developed in a systematic manner,
and this makes the third apparently
extensive chute of ore known to exist
there. The mill, which is one of the
most perfectly constructed in the state,
will be put in operation in the early
spring. We look for the Dan to make
a good record.
