BAKER WILL PAVE SOON

Baker City, Jan. 24.—As indicated in his suggestions to the members of the city council at its last meeting, Mayor Pollman is in favor of paving the principal streets of Baker City, provided it can be done right, both in regard to quality and price.

He is not in favor of rushing the matter through, however, without due preparation and investigation as to the character of work done in the neighboring cities by contractors who are likely to bid on such work, etc. With all this in view, the city attorney has been instructed to prepare an ordinance for paving at least three of the principal streets of the city, viz: Front, from Auburn to Campbell; First, from Auburn to Central; and Second, from Front to the depot, between Court and Washington streets, between Front and First streets.

It is generally believed that the objection and delay in paving has heretofore been or will be, that there will be no opportunity for the improvement. It is expected that the work will be done soon and will hold our place in the front rank of enterprising western cities.

INSTALL NEW ARC

Workmen have commenced the installation of eleven new arc lights at various locations of the city, as prescribed by ordinance passed by the council. The work will be completed in a short time. The locations of the new lights are:

- First Ward—One at the corner of C and Third streets; one at corner of Fourth and F avenue.
- Second Ward—One at corner Ninth and Washington; one at corner Elm and Jefferson; one at corner Adams and Balm.
- Third Ward—One at corner Jefferson and Third; one corner Adams and Walnut; one corner Grandy and Second.
- Fourth Ward—One corner North Fir and W avenue; one corner North and Y, and one corner North and S street.

Roads Are Bad.
The roads leading to the city are in a wretched condition so those report who have had occasion to travel over them lately. This was occasioned by the recent thaw which remained long enough so that the highways were cut to pieces and then the freeze took place leaving them as rough as a cobble stone pavement in some places, and without bottom in others. The fact was noticeable yesterday owing to the large number who failed to make their usual Saturday shopping visit to the city.
