### A Useless Trip.

Cosgrove said: "I can't understand why it is necessary to make this trip. I am now governor of Washington, and have been since the returns of the November election were canvassed by the legislature, but in order to satisfy certain interests at Olympia, I am going there to be formally sworn in. I am feeling unusually well, have a normal appetite and am slowly gaining in weight and strength, but expect it will be several months before I will return to take up active management of my office.

relative to the canal.

Rainey referred to the government investigation of Senator Tillman's action in depriving the government of a revenue of two cents by using a frank, adding that this matter was considered of enough importance by Roosevelt to embody it in a special message to congress. He said he had not heard of secret service agents disturbing Senator Lodge. "Yet he is directly, individually and solely responsible for taking \$1,000,000 from the treasury."

He charged that Obaldia, the new president of Panama, represented all that is corrupt in Spanish and American politics. He charged Cromwell with keeping the minutes of the board of directors of the Panama railroad company and writing them to "suit himself." He hinted that a combination controlled or dominated by Cromwell was administering the affairs of the Panama railroad as it seen fit, although every share is ostensibly owned by the government. He charges Charles Taft with visiting the isthmus to further Cromwell's plans, and claims there is an "established and absolute fact of a combination involving Chas. Taft, Cromwell and their friends, to force the election of Obaldia."
