HAS PRACTICAL FACILITIES

PRESIDENT HOMAN AND HIS SALEM UNIVERSITY.

Willamette University an Institution With Few Equals in Northwest States.

Picture a man, with the erectness of an Indian, the smile of a school boy, the handshake of a vote-getter, the brain of an educator of the school of today, and there is formed a mental sketch of Fletcher Homan, president of Willamette university at Salem, who was in the city last evening for a short time en route to his duties at the state's capital. Fletcher Homan is a practical man of the minute—a competent personage to head the rapidly growing school of learning known as Willamette university. To the untaught ear "Willamette" conveys an impression of a school where Methodism is taught, but where practical collegiate courses are in the background. Such, by all means, is not the case.

La Grande has especial interest in that school, for there it is that A. E. Eaton of Union, has erected a \$50,000 hall. The university is conducted on a practical basis. The entrance requirements are as broad as for any school in the land, its university courses as long as the longest, and in many cases as broad as the broadest on the Pacific slope. Its law school has an advantage few institutions can claim. It has easy access to the supreme court library, one that is unexcelled in the Pacific northwest. Supreme court judges deliver frequent lectures to the students. Its college of medicine has the state insane asylum, the penitentiary, and the deaf and dumb school within a stone's throw of the campus, where advance and practical studies can be carried on. The theological department is but one college of the university, and it is up to the high standard of the rest. The college of music has one of the finest men in musical and classical lines in the northwest at its head. The endowments to the school have made it possible to secure and retain the best faculty of any denominational school of the Pacific coast.

The man who last week was inaugurated president of the institution comes from Simpson college in Iowa, where he was vice-president. His twentieth century education was acquired in some of the best colleges and universities of the middle west. With so many salient points in favor of the school, it is no wonder that the institution grows, for he administers the affairs of the place of learning with the same deliberateness and vim that he used to score touchdowns on the gridiron and add up the baseball scores for his alma mater.
